Methodology

12,005 adults were interviewed by telephone between 11 July and 11 August 2014 in the following constituencies:

Bedford (1,000: 23 – 30 July)
Carlisle (1,001: 11 – 16 July)
Dewsbury (1,000: 15 – 23 July)
Lincoln (1,000: 14 – 21 July)
Plymouth Sutton & Devonport (1,003: 15 – 23 July)
Stroud (1,000: 11 – 16 July)
Warrington South (1,000: 22 – 31 July)
Weaver Vale (1,001: 14 – 22 July)
Birmingham Edgbaston (1,000: 31 July – 11 August)
Bolton West (1,000: 23 – 31 July)
Hampstead & Kilburn (1,000: 23 July – 3 August)
Southampton Itchen (1,000: 31 July – 11 August)

For each constituency, results were weighted to be representative of all adults living in the constituency. Results are weighted by recalled past vote at the last general election and stated likelihood to turn out at the next. A proportion of those who don't know or refuse to say how they will vote are re-allocated to the party they voted for at the 2010 general election. The eight Conservative seats selected were the next most marginal to those previously polled (results published in May and July 2014). The four Labour seats are those with the closest results from the Labour seats previously polled (results published in May 2014).
