For each constituency, results were weighted to be representative of all adults living in the constituency. Results are weighted by recalled past vote at the last general election and stated likelihood to turn out at the next. A proportion of those who don't know or refuse to say how they will vote are re-allocated to the party they voted for at the 2010 general election. The Con-held Lib Dem targets were the two most competitive seats among those surveyed in June 2014. The Conservative targets are the 15 most marginal Lib Dem-held seats in England with the Conservatives in second place. The remaining five seats represent a selection of more ambitious Lib Dem-held Labour target seats in England.
